Wyott Russell serves as a Solution Architect for WFR Technologies supporting INTERPOL Washington, the United States National Central Bureau (USNCB). As a part of the WFR Technologies, Wyott's duties are to facilitate and implement Law Enforcement Information Sharing Programs. He has been the lead for both U.S. domestic and international INTERPOL related capacity-building programs. Wyott has been in this role since 2001.

Through Project TERMINUS, Wyott has engaged with and assisted several INTERPOL member countries in their efforts to leverage INTERPOL data to secure their borders and contribute to the global security effort.
