### **Program Manager** **Carl L. McClafferty**

Carl L. McClafferty is the Program Manager for the United States National Central Bureau's (USNCB) Project Terminus.

Prior to his current assignment at the USNCB, Mr. McClafferty served as the Division Chief of the U.S. Border Patrol Intelligence Division at U.S. Border Patrol Headquarters in Washington, DC. With oversight of intelligence and related programs, he provided subject-matter expertise to Headquarters' leadership and U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) staff officers. During this time, he was also assigned to the USNCB for a two-year temporary assignment as the Assistant Director for the Border Security Division.

Mr. McClafferty entered on duty with the U.S. Border Patrol on August 28, 1995. His first duty assignment as a Border Patrol agent was in the Tucson, Arizona Sector. In 1999, he was promoted to Supervisor at the Nogales, Arizona Station. In 2002, he transferred to the U.S. Border Patrol Academy as a Physical Techniques Course Development Instructor. In 2004, Mr. McClafferty was promoted to Assistant Chief in the Special Operations Division at Border Patrol Headquarters. In 2006, he transferred to New Mexico as the Agent in Charge of the Deming Station, a location with more than 16,000 square miles of operational area. He returned to Headquarters in 2008 as the Associate Chief for Special Operations and Special Programs and later assumed the Division Chief of Intelligence in August 2016. In 2010, he served as the Department of Homeland Security Liaison Officer at the United States Forces Iraq (USF-I) Headquarters in Baghdad, Iraq.

Throughout his 30-year career, Mr. McClafferty has participated in Operation Desert Shield, the West Desert Initiative, the Arizona Border Control Initiative, Operation Iraqi Freedom, and Operation Jump Start. He also provided security and related support for the 2002 Winter Olympics Games in Salt Lakes City, Utah. He was instrumental in developing the Border Patrol's Special Operations Group (SOG), nationalizing the Border Patrol Search, Trauma and Rescue Unit (BORSTAR), and the establishing the Mobile Response Team.

Mr. McClafferty became a member of BORSTAR in 1999 after successfully completing BORSTAR Academy Class 2. He served as the Tucson Sector BORSTAR Commander from 2000 to 2001. In 2008, he also served as the SOG Director in El Paso, Texas.

Mr. McClafferty is a graduate of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, the Arizona Law Enforcement Training Academy and CBP's Leadership Institute.

Carl L. McClafferty is 51 years old and a native of Youngstown, Ohio.
