PROJECT TERMINUS

Strengthening the ability of law enforcement and border security agencies to detect and interdict illicit international travel of Foreign Terrorist Fighters (FTF) and Transnational Criminals

The United States National Central Bureau's Project TERMINUS mission is to extend the INTERPOL's I-24/7 secure global police communications system in high-risk areas and select host nations globally.

By enhancing INTERPOL screening & record submission capabilities of INTERPOL member countries through purpose-built, custom software and provided computer equipment, Project Terminus enables partner nations to quickly implement solutions that directly impact domestic and global security.

Due to challenges with technology and expertise, many countries lack the tools to properly leverage INTERPOL data, including the INTERPOL Stolen and Lost Travel Document Database (SLTD), containing records for more than 100 million travel documents. By ensuring that law enforcement officers have access to INTERPOL's I-24/7 system, front-line authorities can search and cross-check traveler data in seconds and share sensitive or urgent police information with partners around the globe in real-time, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.



PROJECT TERMINUS Method of Implementation

Phase I Method of Implementation

INTERPOL Washington consultants will conduct a technical needs assessment to help determine what adjustments and equipment are required to enhance SLTD contribution capabilities and integrate INTERPOL's I-24/7 system in their border and immigration screening systems.

Phase II Installation

INTERPOL Washington will assist member countries with installation and integration of technical solutions to enable the automatic contribution of lost or stolen travel documentation into the SLTD database.

Phase III Full Integration

INTERPOL Washington will help provide full integration of the I-24/7 tools and services into existing national immigration and border screening systems. I-24/7 training will be provided for the implementation of effective border security safeguards and management techniques.
